Man Convicted in 2014 Multiple Homicide Case

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Greene County Prosecuting Attorney Dan Patterson announces that Scott A. Goodwin-Bey, 57, of Springfield, MO was convicted today by a Greene County Jury on four counts of murder in a case dating back to the fall of 2014. The jury deliberated for nearly two days on the case against Scott Goodwin-Bey following a five-day jury trial.

Springfield police detectives tied Goodwin-Bey to a firearm used to kill Trevor Fantroy, Lewis Green, Danielle Keyes, and Christopher Freeman in November 2014 inside room 149 at the Economy Inn on North Glenstone Avenue. A witness told police he played dead in the motel room during the incident and then fled.

The Defendant was initially charged with the murders in February 2015. The charges were dismissed in December 2016 after Judge Calvin Holden ruled against the ballistics evidence used to tie him to the gun used in the shootings. The case was refiled in 2018 while the defendant was serving a Federal sentence for possessing the gun used in the murders. Following a hearing on expert ballistics testimony, the Honorable Judge Joshua Christensen ruled that the testimony was admissible.

The jury trial was presided over by The Honorable Joshua Christensen. Judge Christensen set a sentencing hearing for November 21, 2024 at 10:00 am following a sentencing assessment report by the Department of Probation and Parole.

This case is being prosecuted by Chief Assistant Prosecuting Attorneys
Joshua Harrel and First Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Kim Pulley. It was
investigated by the Springfield Police Department and Detective Christopher Barb
was the lead investigator assigned to the case.
